1. BEGINNING THE DISCIPLESHIP JOURNEY

Setting the First Discipleship Appointment

You: (Partner's Name eg Eric or Dora) You have a personal relationship with Christ. But this is only the beginning. We have met today. In this sense we have a friendship, but suppose that after today we never communicate with each other again. Will our friendship grow?

Partner: No

You: Why Not?

Partner: Because friendship depends on getting to know the other person and that takes constant communication.

You: Right, it's the same way with Christ. Even though you have a relationship with Him, if your friendship is going to grow, you need to learn how to know Him better. The better we know God, the more we will be able to trust Him. How do you think a friendship grows, (Partner's name)?

Partner: It grows by spending time together, talking with one another and doing things together.

You: That's right. In other words, we need to learn how to communicate with Christ and allow Him to communicate with us. We need to learn how to spend time with Him so our friendship will grow. (Partner's name), I would like to get together with you and share how you can build your friendship with Christ. Would you be interested?

Partner: Yes.

You: Can we meet here (or as appropriate) at 5 pm tomorrow God willing?

Partner: Yes.

You: That's great! Let's write that down. I really enjoyed talking to you today. See you tomorrow at 5 pm, God willing.

2. FORMAT OF DISCIPLESHIP MEETING

1. Sharing (10 minutes):

Walk with God, Relationship with others, Personal issues (academics, finances, family, work etc.), Ministry to others. Pray for one another if needed at this time.

2. Content (40minutes):

Go through the lesson/content together. Agree on a Scripture to memorize for the week/review.

3. Summary & Closing (10 minutes):

Ask each one to share one lesson learnt.

Communicate any info — witnessing, schedule one-on-one time if it was a group meeting, next meeting.

Close in Prayer.

ONE-ON-ONE TEACHING/LEARNING MOMENTS

Do this on purpose once a week or as and when applicable. Ask the following questions:

- 1. How are you?
- 2. What is God teaching you?
- 3. What steps have you taken, or will you take as a result of what you are learning?
- 4. Any challenges?
- 5. How can I pray with you?
